### Friday, January 9, 8 PM, \$12.00 THE WIYOS/BERTRAND LAURENCE



Named after the toughest street gang of old New York, **the WIYOS** play old timey American music - vaudevillian ragtime
blues, early swing, jugband and old time country. The guartet is
comprised of **Parrish Ellis** - guitars and vocals; **Joseph**"joebass" **DeJarnette** - upright bass and vocals; **Michael Farkas** - washboard, harmonica, vocals; and new member, **Teddy Weber**, adding vocals, steel slide and acoustic guitar.
The Wiyos transport listeners back to a time before TV and
mass-media were the main sources of entertainment, to the
days when music could be heard on live radio and at community
dances, juke joints and house parties. Incorporating elements of

physical comedy and theatricality, The WIYOS create an interactive show in the tradition of vaudevillian performers like Fats Waller, Spike Jones and Uncle Dave Macon.



Tonight's split concert will begin with a set by French finger-style acoustic guitarist and songwriter **Bertrand Laurence** who is celebrating the CD release of "6 & 12 String Guitar Music." Laurence is a master of the art of country blues fingerpicking and slide guitar, but he's no purist. His live shows feature traditional, contemporary, and original blues but are full of surprises including swing tunes, ragtime, boogie, rockabilly,... even blues sung in French! Inspired by childhood heroes, Laurence tries to recapture in his music the exuberance of Jelly Roll Morton and the rocking guitar style of Big Bill Broonzy. Having spent a number of years as a performance artist, Laurence also knows how to put on a show and his time working at a

homeless shelter also taught him the healing power of the blues. "I like to focus on the upside of the blues," he says. "I'm into joy and celebration."

**Genticorum** has quickly become one of the most sought-after proponents of Québécois musical culture. This energetic, traditional 'power trio' incorporates the dynamism of today's diverse North American and European folk cultures in their music while remainingfirmly rooted in the soil of their native land. Their new CD, "La Bibournoise," was released in 2008 and was named "Best Traditional Album Of The Year" at the 2008 CANADIAN FOLK MUSIC AWARDS. Weaving wooden flute, fiddle,

acoustic guitar, jaw harp, bass, and foot percussion with strong vocal harmonies, they produce a brilliant tapestry which gives them their distinctive sound. Cory Pesaturo, a 21-year old resident of Cumberland, is a graduate of the prestigious New England Conservatory of Music in Boston, MA, where he was the first musician to ever major in accordion. Cory's extensive resumé includes appearances at the White House on four different occasions; he was also the youngest musician to ever play at a State Dinner at age 12. Cory has won the New England Cup Accordion Competition three times, and the National Accordion Competition 4 times (at age 15, he was the youngest person to ever win the US National Accordion Championship.) Tonight's show will feature Cory playing many styles of music, from classical to Klezmer to jazz to

Balkan and more as he performs with several guest musicians and his trio comprised of **Tal Gamlieli** from Israel on bass and **Tyson Stubelek** from Oregon on drums. Both are also New England Conservatory graduates.

Cory has recently recorded two CDs with legendary sax player George Garzone and his band The Fringe. At the 2007 World Accordion Championships, Cory was hailed as the best jazz accordionist in the World, as none of his competitors included improvisation.

New England has long had a rich tradition of Celtic-inspired music. Having celebrated their 25th anniversary in 2008, the Rhode Island-based ensemble Pendragon has embraced that tradition and created a timeless sound of its own, performing roots music with an unmistakable contemporary edge. The band recently released their 8th album, "Still Standing," on Blackstone River Theatre's RiverFolk Productions label. Pendragon's music celebrates the lives and

lore of generations of New Englanders who brought traditions from Ireland, Scotland, French Canada and other distant shores to the banks of the Blackstone River. Past tributes include three straight Boston Music Award nominations for Outstanding Celtic Act and a Governor's Tourism Award. Pendragon was voted Rhode Island's Best Celtic Act in the 2008, 2007, 2006 and 2005 MOTIF Magazine Music Poll. The band has also been voted Best Local Folk Act of the Year in the Providence Phoenix' Best Music Poll eight times. The three original members of Pendragon, Bob Drouin, Mary Lee Partington and Russell Gusetti, all grew up in Cumberland and are all Cumberland High School alumni. They are also the founders and directors of Cumberland's Blackstone River Theatre. Since reopening in September, 2000, after a four-year, volunteer renovation effort, Blackstone River Theatre has presented 850 arts and cultural events in front of more than 55,000 audience members. While drawing on the ethnic music of the Blackstone River Valley, Pendragon fashions the music of tradition into the music of tomorrow performing their original songs and dance tunes on an innovative combination of bouzouki, fiddle, concertina, banjo, quitar, whistle, flute, percussion and step dance. Pendragon is comprised of step dancer and percussionist Kevin Doyle, Bob Drouin on fiddle, bouzouki and tenor banjo; Russell Gusetti on guitar and concertina; Josh Kane on flute and whistles; and Mary Lee Partington on vocals.

Join the **Dixie Diehards Jazz Band** for a raucus, Mardi Gras-style show as they dish out a thick gumbo of traditional New Orleans Jazz! The Dixie Diehards, whose lineup includes a medical doctor, a retired college professor and an investigative reporter among others, shares at least one thing in common: a passion for the "hot jazz" and blues of the early 20th century. The era, typified by such greats as Louis Armstrong, Fats Waller and Jelly Roll Morton, firmly established jazz as "America's music" and set the direction for much of subsequent pop

culture. The term "Dixieland" refers to a form of small group jazz which typically includes a trumpet, a clarinet and a trombone and often a tuba combined with a rhythm section that may include a banjo, percussion or bass player as well as a piano. In most arrangements, the trumpet plays the melody while other elements freely

improvise around it or paraphrase the melody in creative solos. The Dixie Diehards have won an enthusiastic reception across southern New England for bringing an irrepressible sense of fun and frolic to their shows. That attitude almost always includes audience sing-alongs, spontaneous dance outbursts (remember the Charleston?) and a spirit of "wonderful nonsense." The lineup includes **Jim Kelleher** on trombone, **Santo Pullara** on clarinet; **Bill Kiesewetter** on sax, **Alan Shapiro** on trumpet; **Steve Shaw** on tuba; **Dolly Fruzzetti** on piano; **Dale Ellenberg** on drums; **Chris Wadsworth** on banjo, and **Rick Foster** on vocals/cornet. *Don't miss a rare BRT matinee show sure to be fun for all ages!* 

#### Friday, February 13, 8 PM, \$10.00 RORY RAVEN - Mentalist and mindbender



It has become a BRT tradition to do something a little different for a Friday the 13th show and we've certainly found it! **Rory Raven** is a mentalist with over 13 year's experience (there's that number again!) reading minds and astonishing audiences. Neither a psychic nor a magician, he offers a new and compelling kind of entertainment unlike anything audiences have ever seen. With a few simple props (paper and pencil, a pack of playing cards, some paperback books, and the thoughts of some volunteers) Rory involves the audience in a highly unusual - and unusually entertaining - experience. Thoughts are revealed, predicitions come true, and perhaps even the spirits are summoned... Rory is also

well-known for leading people on his Providence Ghost Walk; he also recently released his first book, "Haunted Providence: Strange Tales from the Smallest State." Frequently Asked Questions: Okay, let's start with that title - what's a mentalist? A mentalist is a theatrical mind-reader... a performer who, using a variety of techniques, is able to produce results that would only seem possible by psychic or paranormal means. And those techniques would be...? They range from a knowledge of subtle psychological principles and the quirks of human behavior, to quick thinking and a good memory. Rory is also interested in things like suggestion, non-verbal communication, and the so-called trance state. And he doesn't hesitate to borrow ideas from the stage magician, either! So is he psychic or what? No. Not everyone believes him when he say that, but there's not much he can do about it he explains. People who believe in the paranormal will believe no matter what he tells them, and those who don't believe won't believe no matter what he shows them. But a long time ago Rory realized that everybody's mind is pretty much made up before they came to a show, so it was a fool's errand to try and convince people of the validity of one viewpoint or another. So we invite you to sit back, concentrate on your mother's maiden name, and enjoy the show...

Winners of the 2007 Motif Magazine "Best Folk Act" award, the four-member **Atwater-Donnelly Band**, includes Aubrey, Elwood, **Cathy Clasper-Torch** (fiddle, cello, and vocals) and **Kevin Doyle** (percussion, Irish step and tap dance). BRT favorites **Aubrey Atwater** and **Elwood Donnelly** return tonight with multi-instrumentalist **Cathy Clasper-Torch** and percussionist/dancer **Kevin Doyle** to present another engaging concert of traditional

American and Celtic American folk songs, a cappella pieces, hymns, poetry, dance tunes, and original works. Saturday, February 21, 8 PM, \$12.00 MATT & SHANNON HEATON - CD release



Guitarist/singer **Matt Heaton** and Irish flute player/singer **Shannon Heaton** have been making music together since 1992. Together, they built up their traditional Irish music skills on flute and guitar in the Chicago sessions. When they began bringing in singing, they focused on their favorite aspects of both Irish and American traditions, ending up with new songs that sound traditional, alongside centuries-old ballads with fresh new melodies. For years, the two

worked as active side players for major Celtic acts including Robbie O'Connell, Aoife Clancy, Boys of the Lough, and Emily Smith. After releasing two previous duo albums, several things happened to push Matt and Shannon's new CD, "Lovers' Well," in the direction it took. While assembling songs for the record, they realized that all the material was a love song of some sort or another. Being a CD of traditional Irish ballads, many of the stories don't have happy endings, but they all explore various dynamics of lovers (passion, flirtation, jealousy, despair). Unapolagetically traditional in style, with bold American roots on full display, the Heatons bring respect and glee to these centuries-old ballads. Even the instrumental numbers on the album have love titles and were written to commemorate lovers ("The Newmarried Couple," "The First Date.") When deciding where to record, their friend offered her cottage in Wellfleet on Cape Cod. Producer/fiddler Eric Merrill agreed to load up his gear and spend a week there recording with them and the result was a relaxed and natural process which captured the music in the spirit it was intended. The tracks have an organic nature about them-crickets, rain and other noises made their way into the microphones. Adding in some of the finest players in New England (Keith Murphy, Kieran Jordan, Nic Gareiss, and Dan Gurney), "Lovers' Well" has an energy which bursts out of the speakers. ### Saturday, February 28, 8 PM, \$12.00 THE BEE EATERS - CD release



The Bee Eaters is a new group that boasts four of the most accomplished, creative young talents of the new generation, tracing roots back to the musical traditions of Bluegrass, Old-time, Celtic, Jazz and Pop. The quartet combines the strong, striking music of hammered dulcimer virtuoso Simon Chrisman and banjo phenomenon Wes Corbett with the inimitable sound of brother-sister fiddle duo Tristan and Tashina Clarridge. The result of the foursome's

collaboration is an elegant fusion of tradition and innovation. Says fiddle legend Darol Anger, "The Bee Eaters are the instrumental cream of the brand new string nation. Harking back to the 'grand old days' when new virtuosos seemed to spring onto the scene fully formed with a whole repertoire of brilliant music nobody had ever heard before, somehow these kids have absorbed everything we had to offer and alchemized it into a new musical world." Tonight will be the CD release of their debut project. Tristan Clarridge, an inventive cellist and 5-time Grand National Fiddle Champion, tours internationally with Crooked Still and Darol Anger's Republic of Strings, and has also appeared with Mike Marshall, Bruce Molsky and Natalie MacMaster. Tashina Clarridge, the 2005 Grand National Fiddle Champion, has toured with Mark O'Connor and Tony Trischka, and performed at Carnegie Hall as part of MacArthur Fellow/Grammy-winning bassist Edgar Meyer's Young Artists program. 22year-old banjoist Wesley Corbett has appeared with the David Grisman Quintet and Matt Glaser, and toured internationally with bluegrass sensation The Biscuit Burners. Hammered dulcimer wizard Simon Chrisman has performed with Mike Marshall and Darol Anger, opened for Bill Frisell, and at 16 was a scholarship guest artist at the Augusta Heritage Festival in West Virginia. His sophisticated rhythmic sense and ingenious tonal flexibility, on an instrument usually considered limited, has created a buzz among musicians all over the world. Advance ticket purchase strongly recommended! Awardwinning guitarist **Duke Robillard** has traveled the world over for the last 40 years entertaining audiences with his special blend of blues and classic jazz. He's recorded with, played with, or produced many of the most important artists of the last several decades including Bob Dylan, Tom Waits, Ruth Brown, and the Fabulous Thunderbirds. With 20 albums under his own name and many more as guitarist with countless artists, Duke has

achieved what many only dream of - working with many of his legendary musical heroes. But there is one project that has been in the back of Duke's mind since he heard Ivie Anderson, Helen Humes and Billie Holiday nearly 40 years ago - to celebrate the rich era of women song stylists from the thirties to the fifties - women who brought poise and class to the great American songs of the time, and who interpreted the best lyrics of the American master songwriters with depth, sincerity, and a personal flair that's all but forgotten today. That project has never been realized until late 2007 when he heard **Sunny Crownover** sing at a show at Harvard University. Duke says "Her relaxed style and natural stage presence started the wheels turning. I felt I had finally found the vocalist I had been hoping to discover for so many years." Duke wasted no time finding material and enlisting a crew of great musicians to join forces, and Sunny and Her Joy Boys were born. Billy Novick joined in on clarinet and alto sax. An acknowledged master of his instruments. Billy has toured for 35 years, has been a member of the acclaimed New Black Eagle Jazz Band for two decades, and has five solo CDs and nine duo CDs with Guy Van Duser. Bassist **Jesse Williams** has played and recorded with Duke for five years. He is also currently recording and performing with Al Kooper and Jay Geils. Guitarist Paul Kolesnikow and Duke have been playing together in duo, trio and quartet situations for many years now and he helps with the group's arrangements. - 1. Demonstration of several blues and swing styles. Duke will attempt to answer all your questions about guitar and guitar playing.
- 2. Subjects covered will include soloing, comping, chord progressions and inversions.
- 3. Duke will also demonstrate points on phrasing, mixing chords, single note runs and double stops in the same solo. He will also explore how

to play on top of or behind the beat to add tension and emotional effect in solos as well as adding passing chords in simple progressions to make them more interesting.

- 4. Duke will be accompanied by **Mark Texeiria** on drums and **Jesse Williams** on bass for part of the seminar and there will be a period for attendees to come up and jam on a song onstage with them.

With their stunning fourth CD, "Flower & Iron,"

Malinky celebrates their tenth anniversary and introduce a newly revamped line-up while underscoring their reputation as one of Scotland's most distinctive and accomplished folk bands. While retaining their hallmark song-based repertoire, performed by three superb lead vocalists with inventive instrumentation, Malinky today unites seasoned maturity with a new energy. Ten years after

they debuted, the two remaining members from that founding line-up - Steve Byrne (vocals/bouzouki/guitar) and Mark Dunlop (vocals/whistles/bodhrán) - are now joined by Fiona Hunter (vocals/cello), who replaced original lead singer Karine Polwart in 2005, alongside recent recruits Dave Wood (quitar/bouzouki) and Mike Vass (fiddle). Malinky was nominated for the 2008 Scottish Traditional Music Awards in the category of "Scottish Folk Band of the Year," while Fiona Hunter was also nominated as "Scots Singer of the Year." Malinky's three previous recordings, Last Leaves (2000), 3 Ravens (2002) and The Unseen Hours (2005), all on top Scottish folk label Greentrax, have each won successively greater acclaim, establishing the band not only as outstanding interpreters of traditional song, but as equally gifted exponents of contemporary material. "I think the mix of material and moods on the new project really reflects how the band sounds now, and how we've progressed since the last album," says Hunter. "We've still got the big dark ballads in there, but they're balanced with more upbeat, contemporary songs." After kicking off 2009 with a special tenth anniversary show at Celtic Connections, they are making their Rhode Island debut tonight.



He has recorded and produced over forty albums of traditional music and acted as advisor for scores of festivals and concerts all over America. Mick also served as the artistic director for several major arts tours including The Green Fields of America, an ensemble of Irish musicians, singers and dancers which toured across the United States on several occasions. He has hosted three nationally syndicated series of folk music on American Public Television; was a consultant, performer and interviewee on the Irish Television special "Bringing It All Back Home"; a participant, consultant and music arranger of the PBS documentary film "Out of Ireland"; and a performer on the PBS special "The Irish in America: Long Journey Home." In 1999 he was awarded the National Heritage Award from the National Endowment for the Arts - the highest official honor a traditional artist can receive in the United States. Born in London of Irish-speaking parents, **Jimmy Keane** is an All-Ireland accordion champion for five consecutive years. Many regard Keane as the premier exponent of traditional Irish music on the piano accordion. Noted University of Limerick Professor, composer, and musician Mícheál Ó Súilleabháin praised Keane as the "savior of the piano accordion." Emusic described him as "one of the true giants of Irish traditional music of the past fifty years." Keane formed the group Aengus with Robbie O'Connell and his current group bohola was initially formed with Sean Cleland and Pat Broaders after Sean and Pat joined Jimmy on an Aengus tour.

Emiliano's program will include music by Monteverdi, a medley of saucy tarantellas from the early 1800s, and songs from the 1920s, '40s and '60s. When a musician is as likely to be found playing a ferocious set of reels in some dark pub in Ireland as he is to be found trading licks with a saxophonist at a hip New York City jazz club - and he is occasionally even seen doing such apparently odd-ball things as exploring Indian classical music on stage at Carnegie Hall - one starts to wonder... what is it that drives him? Whatever the source of **Jeremy Kittel**'s inspiration may be, it has led to a dizzying heap of accomplishments and opportunities, one of which is his recent inclusion as a full-time member of the Grammy award-winning Turtle Island Quartet. Just prior to joining Turtle Island Quartet, Kittel was earning his masters

degree in jazz performance at the Manhattan School of Music and skipping town on weekends to perform across the country alongside fiddle legends Mark O'Connor and Darol Anger. He has won multiple U.S. National Scottish Fiddle Championships, six Detroit Music Awards for both folk and jazz, and has released three highly acclaimed solo CDs. In addition to many great guest musicians, the core musicians on his new CD, Chasing Sparks, are Kittel's own bandmates, who shine throughout and, somehow, manage to share quite a bit of common musical ground with him. Guitarist **Kyle Sanna** possesses a knack for musical balance that recently led cellist nonpareil Yo-Yo Ma to hire him as an arranger for his 2008 Sony Classical recording. Cellist Tristan Clarridge is a member of bluegrass sensation Crooked Still and is a threetime National Fiddle Champion himself. And cosmopolitan drummer Bodek Janke (he's fluent in five languages) lends deep, visceral grooves with echoes of Africa, India, and Eastern Europe. Each track is woven with earthy, Celtic-inspired melodies; sometimes as a jumping-off point for intricate compositions; other times inducing heady improvisations; still other times maintaining a simpler, more traditional feel.
